The Southee All Rounder Trophy

Dr. Ken Langford a graduate of Hawkesbury Agricultural College and the Chair of the E.A. Southee Memorial Trust Scholarship Committee presented the "The Southee All Rounder Trophy for 2018 to Lillian Chick at our Presentation Evening.

The Trust was initiated in the early 1980's by staff and students of Hawkesbury Agricultural College of Advanced Education, as a scholarship generating foundation honouring the memory of E.A. Southee. Funded by sponsorships, bequeaths, donations, raffles and a major art union, a corpus of funds was established managed by both financial trust and scholarship distributing groups. The corpus has grown to well over \$400,000 and produces a working undergraduate, postgraduate and alumni scholarship fund of \$12000 per year. Hawkesbury Agricultural College has now become an antecedent institution known as The Hawkesbury Campus of Western Sydney University. After I was appointed as Chair of The Scholarship Committee I decided to research the history of Ethelbert Ambrook Southee and discovered that he was not only born in Cootamundra but there existed a Primary School in Cootamundra named in his honour.

It was suggested to the Southee Scholarship Committee that they should establish an on going professional relationship with the E.A. Southee Primary School and pursue the idea of sponsoring a perpetual trophy as an homage to the great man. The Committee were enthusiastic so the school was contacted.

Southee was a special person who throughout his life developed special qualities and attributes in a broad range of pursuits.



As *an intellectual* his research interests were in plant breeding and plant diseases. He was conferred as the NSW Rhodes Scholar entering Oxford University in 1913. He was made a fellow of the Linnean Society in 1919. In 1955 he was awarded the Farrer Memorial Medal for his services to agriculture.

As *an academic* he was awarded three undergraduate degrees from Sydney and Oxford Universities in science, agricultural science and arts, a masters in arts and was admitted to a Doctor of Philosophy at Cornell University but could not continue his studies when appointed as Principal of Hawkesbury Agricultural College (HAC) in 1921.

As *a leader* Southee excelled, he was president of several student organisations at Sydney High School, Sydney University and Oxford University. In 1914 he joined the WW1 expeditionary forces in which he rose to the rank of Major. He served in Belgium, France and Italy and was twice mentioned in despatches for bravery and leadership. He was made an OBE in 1919 for services to The Empire.

As *a sportsman* he pursued both individual and team activities and excelled in them all. Southee was the Champion Athlete of Sydney High in 1907. He gained a "Double Blue" from both Sydney and Oxford Universities in athletics and rugby. Southee was the 100-metre champion for all allied forces in Italy in 1919.

As an administrator Southee served as principal of Hawkesbury Agricultural College for 33 years until his retirement in 1954.

In regards to Southee's achievements, a person who not just participates but excels in such a wide variety of traits of the human condition could be termed "an all rounder". Following negotiation with Principal Stevenson, The Committee named the trophy "The Southee All Rounder Trophy".

The Trophy Award Focus plaque reads:

In recognition of the student exhibiting academic, sporting, leadership, community engagement, social responsibility, artistic and teamwork excellence.

The Trophy Dedication plaque reads:

This trophy is designed to honour the memory of E.A. Southee and is sponsored by The E.A. Southee Memorial Trust Scholarship Committee based on the Hawkesbury Campus of Western Sydney University.

This Trophy is called "The Southee All Rounder Trophy" because Southee developed a comprehensive character and temperament that equipped him for a lifetime of personal and professional service.

Many of those inspiring qualities and attributes are symbolised in this award.

The Committee has produced a lapel pin that is presented to university scholarship winners each year. The pin proclaims that the wearer is a "Southee Scholar" we thought it fitting that Liliana Chick - the inaugural winner of The Southee All Rounder Trophy, should receive a lapel pin so that everyone will know from now on, that she is a Southee Scholar!
