Team 3 have been learning about different types of matter in science this week. Students completed a hands-on investigation involving balloons to discover the properties of gas. They observed the behaviour of the balloon and its properties during this experiment.

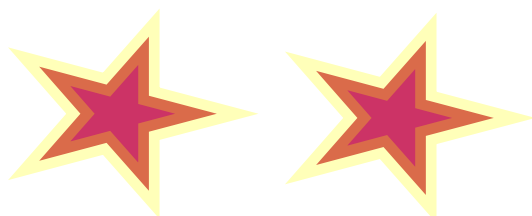

This week our Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) focus across the school is Responsibility.

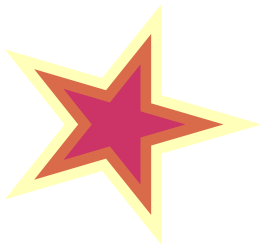
